New Year Message from Bishop George

In looking ahead to 2006 we can all be more hopeful than usual that our diocesan life will take on renewed energy and meaning. We face the New Year with several exciting prospects in view. From my point of view it is the welcome to the diocese of our new Bishop of Sherwood. Tony Porter will be consecrated into his episcopal ministry on Tuesday 21st March in York Minster. This will of course be a very important day for him and his family but also a day symbolising a new beginning in the mission of our diocese to the communities in which we live, both in Nottingham itself where Bishop Tony will be based but also in the diocese as a whole. I know that you will pray for him as he prepares for his ministry among us.

We also begin the New Year with a new title for the diocese. With effect from 15th November last year, following the approval of the Privy Council, we officially became the Diocese of Southwell & Nottingham. At one level this can be seen as (literally) a nominal change but for me it signifies our commitment to raise the awareness throughout the Church of where we are and that our mission is relevant and contemporary.

Having once again celebrated the birth of Christ – the supreme demonstration of God's incarnational care for us as his children – my prayer is that we move into



the New Year with our faith renewed and with a spring in our step in our pilgrimage together.

It is my hope to make a short ecumenical pilgrimage to Rome in February 2006 with Bishop Malcolm, Bishop of Nottingham, as a small symbol of ecumenical co-operation in our mission together.

Three Wise Men arrived by Land Rover

Three Wise Men arrived by Land Rover to begin their journey to join the Holy family nativity scene at Southwell Minster.

The wooden figures, which stand over a metre high, have been hand-carved by wood carver and sculptor, Denise Marshall, who delivered them to the cathedral personally. Denise, who is based in Newark, said: "It's been a privilege because the Minster is such a special place, but it has been a challenge too."

The three Wise Men have been commissioned by the Minster to compliment the terracotta nativity figures. Just two of the figures were produced by Denise last year, so this will be the first time all three Wise Men have been on display. The figures represent three different age groups, young old and middle-aged. They were positioned in different places around the Minster during the two weeks leading up to Christmas, before finally arriving at the nativity scene and the completion of their journey on Christmas day. Denise said each Wise Man, made from lime wood and laminated to make

them more durable, had been sealed for protection. She explained: "They are just about the right size for a child to hug and have been sealed to protect them from sticky fingers!"

Queen approves change of title to: Diocese of Southwell & Nottingham

The Diocese of Southwell has now officially changed its title, following a recent meeting of Her Majesty's Privy Council, which formally endorsed the change of name to be the Diocese of Southwell & Nottingham.

The Bishop of Southwell & Nottingham, the Rt. Rev' George Cassidy said: "I believe this change of title will strengthen our sense of identity, giving greater clarity and enhancing our work in both the city and the county."

The change of title was proposed in February 2005 and was passed for approval to the General Synod of the Church of England during July. The endorsement by the Privy Council, marked the final stage in the official process of changing the title.

Time Travelling project scoops national heritage award

An innovative schools project based at Southwell Minster, which celebrated its 10th anniversary this year, has received a national heritage award for Education.

Southwell Minster's Time Travelling project, which is backed by the Diocese of Southwell & Nottingham, draws more than 7,000 children from across the county for its series of daily programmes during the year.

The Sandford Award for Heritage Education recognises an education service of quality and integrity which contributes to heritage education within the historic environment. The award, which was presented by David Lammy, MP, Minister for Culture, DCMS, was awarded for the education service provided jointly by Time Travelling and the Minster Education Officer, Toni Bush.

Assistant Manager for Time Travelling, Diana Ives said: "It is a real credit to our volunteer team that Time Travelling and the Education Office at the Minster continue to provide such a high level of service to so many schools in Nottinghamshire. We are thrilled to have our work officially recognised by an independent organisation."

Diana helps co-ordinate the project with Time Travelling manager, Emma Anderton. Each of the days involves dozens of volunteers, who act as guides for the groups of children from local schools. The days begin with a joint service, before the children split into groups to take part in a whole range of activities around the Minster, from drama and music to learning about fair trade and what a bishop does.

Director of Education for the Diocese of Southwell & Nottingham, the Revd Dr. Howard Worsley said: "Time Travelling is one of those mission projects that has become a major part in the life of Southwell Diocese. It has grown from relatively small beginnings to function annually for key stage one children (age 5 to 7) and



separately for key stage two children (age 7 to 11) with an army of slightly older leaders and pilgrim guides. It is truly All Age in its appeal, fully mission focused in its attention to those on the fringes of Church and definitely educational with its emphasis on the curriculum and teaching of our historic faith as a living reality. Since my time as Director of Education (one year) I've received a stream of compliments for the Diocese about Time Travelling from our Church schools, who cannot get enough of it."

The assessment report for the awards noted that the programme for Time Travelling carefully managed to cater for every eventuality and was an example of organizational genius. During a visit to the project they saw how around 500 children and 70 volunteers, along with members of the public visiting the cathedral, were all organized through a host of fun-packed activities around the Minster.

The next programme of Time Travelling for schools at the Minster will run from 6th -17th March 2006.
